

Call for Papers – Vol. 12 (2024) Hungarian Yearbook of International Law and European Law

The Editors of the Hungarian Yearbook of International Law and European Law are pleased to announce a call for papers for the forthcoming, Vol. 12 (2024) edition of the Yearbook in the following sections:

a, Articles focusing on **the topic 'Hungary in the European Union: 2004-2024: from the accession to the 2024 EU Council Presidency'**, dealing with the relevant laws, policies, legal positions, and judgments of the CJEU concerning Hungary, and the application of the EU law in Hungary (*'Thematic Part'* section)

b, Shorter articles **dedicated to the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Hungarian National Bank (Central Bank of Hungary)** (*'Anniversaries'* section)

c, Articles examining any **current developments** of international law, European law, minority law or national (Hungarian) law with European and/or international relevance (*'Developments in international law'*, *'Developments in European law'*, *'Developments in minority law'*, *'Hungarian State Practice'* sections).

d, **Case Notes** focused on Hungarian (with international relevance) and international (with Hungarian relevance) jurisprudence linked to the years 2023 and 2024, including the case-law of the Constitutional Court of Hungary, ICJ, ECtHR, CJEU and other relevant European/international courts, tribunals and commissions. Be sure that you checked our Case Note Guide at our homepage in advance.

e, **Conference Reports** about conferences with cross-border, European and/or international relevance organized by the Hungarian scientific community. Be sure that you checked our Conference Report Guide on our homepage in advance.

f, **Reviews of books**, written or edited by Hungarian scholars, published in 2023 or 2024 in Hungary or abroad (*'Review of Hungarian and International Scholarly Literature'* section). Be sure that you checked our Book Review Guide on our homepage in advance.

Deadline: Submissions, including a statement of affiliation (in the first footnote of the manuscript, as a starnote), brief abstract (up to 250 words), and confirmation of exclusive submission (in the email or separately) shall be sent by **15 April 2024**, via e-mail: editors@hungarianyearbook.com. Authors are encouraged to share their topics and ideas continuously with Editors, before submitting their contributions.

Language: The Hungarian Yearbook publishes manuscripts in English. The Yearbook prefers American (US) English.

Length Requirements: Articles should not exceed 80 000 characters (including spaces and footnotes). The ideal length of a Case Note is maximum 25 000 characters (with spaces and footnotes). Conference Reports and Book Reviews (up to 20 000 and 15 000 characters, respectively, as a general rule) are also welcomed.

Reference style, samples, homepage: Articles should be submitted in conformity with the Hungarian Yearbook Style Guide, available at <http://www.hungarianyearbook.com> (together with the Case Note Guide, Conference Report Guide and Book Review Guide). Sample articles are also available at our homepage.

Double-Blind Peer Review: All manuscripts (excluding book reviews and conference reports) submitted will be subject to double-blind peer review.

Date of Publication: The Editors aim to publish Vol. 12 (2024) in **October 2024** at the latest (print). The expected date of release of the 'Online First' edition (through the Hungarian Yearbook's own website and through www.elevenjournals.com, for subscribers) is **September 2024**.

About the Hungarian Yearbook: The Hungarian Yearbook of International Law and European Law (ISSN 2666-2701) is published by Eleven (the Hague), an imprint of Boom uitgevers Den Haag, in printed, e-book and 'Online First' form.
